She said that she has seen the warehouse full of Monel and the geiger counters would be going offscale (she said they seldom surveyed their RAM) she said you could tell if a metal was contaminated because of the green tint it would have on its surface.

Dorothy said she has used an electric grinder many times on all types of metal including contaminated and Inconel (she said that the Monel they received was almost always found contaminated when they surveyed it). The only other piece of machinery she used was a bailer. However, contaminated material was not bailed.
